

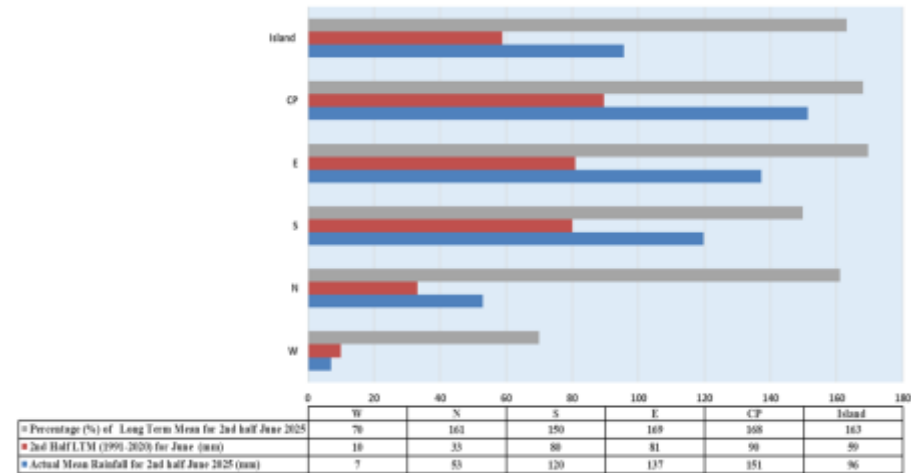
Mauritius Meteorological Services

Mean Rainfall for 16-30 June 2025 updated on 7 July 2025

Mauritius

The second fortnight of June turned out to be wet with 96 mm of rainfall which represents 163 % of the long-term mean.

The Central Plateau recorded the highest rainfall amounting to 151 whereas the East recorded the highest percentage of 169%.
