

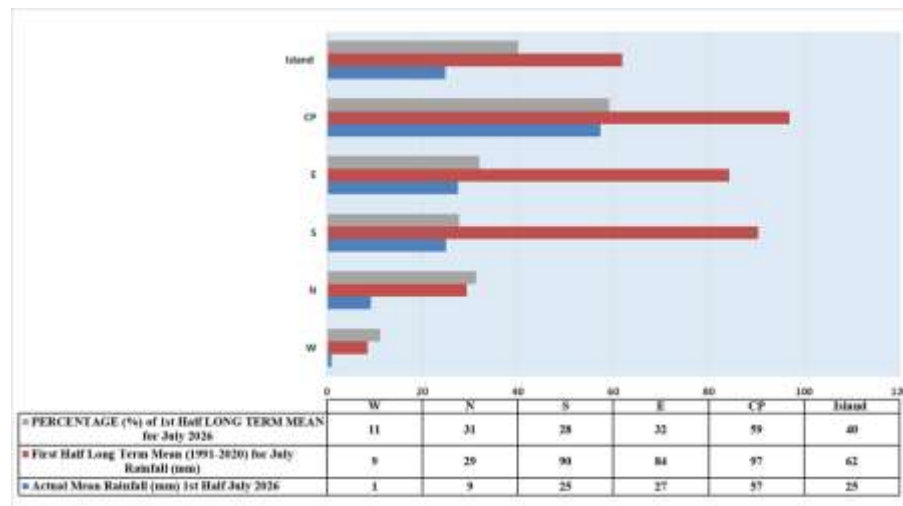

Mean Rainfall for 1-15 July 2026 updated 16 July 2026

Mauritius

Dry atmospheric conditions prevailed over the island during the first fortnight of July 2026 and it was ranked as the second driest first fortnight for July since the last 20 years. The rainfall recorded amounted to 25 mm, representing 40 % of the long-term mean.

The West recorded the lowest rainfall amount of 1 mm and the lowest percentage of 11% of the long-term mean.
