

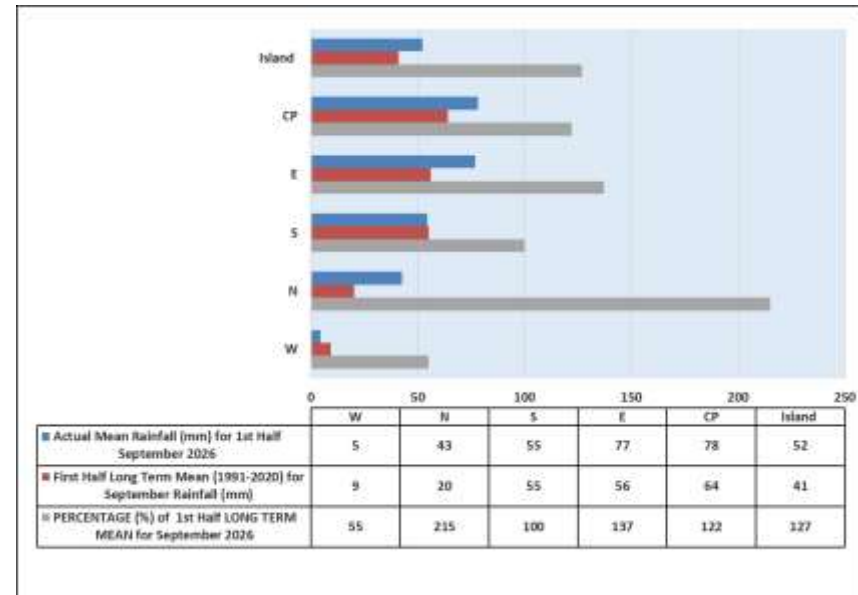

Mean Rainfall for 1-15 September 2026 updated 17 September 2026

Mauritius

The first fortnight of September 2026 was ranked as the fourth wettest first fortnight for September for the last 20 years with 52 mm of rainfall, representing 127 % of the long-term mean.

The Central Plateau recorded the highest rainfall amount of 78 mm, whereas the North had the highest percentage of 215% of the long-term mean.
